June 15, 1914 - August 29, 2007

Adolph Krohn, age 93, of Arlington Township, passed away Wednesday, August 29, 2007 at his home. Mr. Krohn, a lifelong resident of Arlington Township, was born in June of 1914, the son of William and Mary "Bradka" Krohn. He married Jean Richards at the Breedsville United Methodist Church on June 26, 1937. They recently celebrated their 70th anniversary. Mr. Krohn was a graduate of Bangor High School and attended Michigan Agricultural College (MSU). A local leader, he served as a member of the Van Buren County Farm Machinery Rationing Board during WWII and was the first Chairman of the Arlington Township Zoning Board. In his professional life he worked for the USDA Farm Program; as an inspector with the Dairy Herd Inspecting Association of Allegon County; and later as an owner and operator of the Lawrence Grain Elevator. Adolph was also a successful blueberry grower and a mentor to other growers in the area. He loved his work, his garden, and helping others with theirs. He was so good at making farm repairs that his workbench and welder were often centers of neighborhood activity. He also liked to fish, deer hunt, play cards and golf. Adolph especially enjoyed his family and the many friends he had locally and in Florida. Surviving Mr. Krohn are his wife, Jean; daughter, Nancy (James) Saur of Oshtemo; three grandsons, Stephen (Valerie) Saur, Erik (Megan) Saur, Jason Saur; nieces and nephews, Robert (Etta Mae), Anita, Keith (Sally), Mary (Dan), Bill (Barbara), Patricia; special friends and neighbors Jim and Jeanette Wilson; and Adolph's many other nieces, nephews and close friends. wishes, cremation has taken place and a memorial service will be held at 3:00 PM Saturday, September 22, 2007 at Breedsville United Methodist Church.
