Claudia passed away at Bronson Hospital in Kalamazoo on June 22, 2023. She was the daughter of George and Alyce Koenig, born in Chicago, IL, on July 23, 1949. She lived in Chicago with her parents for 8 years until she moved with her mom and her siblings, Mark and Kimberly, in 1958 to Jericho Corners, Michigan. Her mom remarried Wayne Isom in 1958; Wayne was integral to Claudia's life. She graduated from Bangor High School, and after graduating, she went on to College at Western Michigan University. She worked many different jobs, starting as Chef at many restaurants for most of her life. She was a photographer and sports columnist for the South Haven Tribune for many years. When she wasn't working, she enjoyed spending time as Camp Fire Girl Leader and was the beloved coach for the South Haven Rams Varsity Baseball Team. Even though she never married, her cats were her children, and she was an avid sports fan, especially when it came to the Michigan Wolverines, The Detroit Tigers, and the Detroit Lions. She spent many hours cross-stitching, needlepoint, and crocheting when she wasn't watching sports or cooking. Her passion has been being active and in recovery at the Stepping Stones Association; she also led the group and was helping those in recovery.

She is survived by her two Brothers, Jimmy (Cheryl) Isom of South Haven and Jon (Mary) Isom of South Haven; her nieces and nephews, Mathew, Christian, Courtney, Lucas, Kalen, Marcy, Ryan, Jennnah, Michael, Charlene, and

Holden along with many other friends. She was preceded in death by her parents, her brother Mark Koenig, and a sister, Kim Koenig.

According to her wishes, cremation has taken place. The family will receive friends on Wednesday, June 28, 2023, from 11 am to 12 pm, where a memorial service will begin at noon, led by her little brother Jimmy. 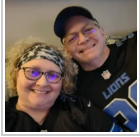
