Edith Rediess passed away Monday, March 21, 2011 at a Grand Haven nursing home. She has lived in area nursing homes for the past 7 years. She lived in the same house in Bangor, for 46 years. Her home was always open to friends and family for a good meal, and caring conversations.

Edith was born to Emil and Marie (Paulson) Rediess on February 15, 1926, in Brush, Colorado. She graduated from the 8th grade in Rawlings, Wyoming in 1934. As a young woman she enjoyed caring for children, and special relationships were made that lasted for a lifetime. She went into the ministry from 1950 through 1956 serving various places in Michigan. Afterward she returned to Bangor, MI and worked at Adams, assembling coils, in Bangor for 10 years. Edith cared for her invalid mother for 12 years. She enjoyed reading her Bible, cooking, canning, sewing, and being with people of her shared faith.

She is survived by her sister Viva Sherman, sister-in-law Micki Rediess, as well several nieces and nephews. Edith was preceded in death by her parents, three brothers; Paul, Melvin, Glen, and sister Octavia.
