Jason V. Fritz, age 45, of Kalamazoo, passed away unexpectedly on March 23, 2021 following a motorcycle accident. Jason was born December 9, 1975 in Kalamazoo, son of Paul and Undine Fritz.

Jason's love of music was apparent from the time he could talk. He was in the Congregational Church Bell Choir and excelled on the euphonium throughout his school career. Jason was a large strong man active in school sports. He played football and set school records in shotput. His academic grades were excellent.

He graduated from Bangor High School in 1994 and earned a bachelor's degree in education from Grand Valley State University and a master's degree in conducting from Western Michigan University.

Jason met and fell in love with Dani Ryskamp. They were married in 2012. Jason loved cooking, gardening, fishing, and hunting for morel mushrooms, but most of all Dani, his brothers and family.

He was employed as music director at Comstock schools and inspired not only his students but everyone he encountered. His compassion and caring for others was who he was. He was a pillar of his family and community and will be remembered, missed and loved always.

Surviving is his wife, Dani; parents, Paul and Undine Fritz; brothers, David (Melissa) Golden, Eric (Debby) Fritz, Carl (Ashley) Fritz; and cousin, Jim (Erin) Bodine. He was preceded in death by grandparents, Vincent and Harriet Fritz and Evert and Janet Bradbury.
