John Kurasz, age 94, of Grand Junction, passed away Friday, September 16, 2011 at South Haven Nursing and Rehabilitation Community. The family will meet friends for a visitation from 6-8 PM Tuesday at the Bangor Chapel, D. L. Miller Funeral Home, where the funeral service will be Wednesday 9:30 AM, with Pastor Jeremiah Johnson officiating. Interment will follow in Arlington Hill Cemetery, Bangor. John was born August 3, 1917 in Chicago, IL, the son of Nicholas and Marie Kurasz and has lived the past 55 years in the Grand Junction area. He was an avid bowler in Bangor and South Haven Leagues for many years. In 1942, John joined the US Army and served in WWII with the 11th Port. On D-Day, December 6, 1944, he and the 11th Port landed on Omaha Beach and were assigned the task of setting up and operating the Port to expedite the movement of troops and equipment. In 1956 he moved his family to Grand Junction and worked for KRT. After a long career with S.E. Overton, he retired in the late 1980's and continued doing the things he loved... bowling, gardening and woodworking. Surviving are his wife, Marjorie; daughter, Ronny Lee Kurasz of Chicago; son, Gregory John Kurasz; daughter-in-law, Rae Kurasz of Arlington, VA; brother, Peter Kurasz of Villa Park, IL; and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his brother, Frank Kurasz and sister, Marge Hoffman.
