Lois Elaine Cooper, age 93, of Bangor passed away of natural causes on November 10 at Meadow Woods Nursing Home in Bloomingdale. Lois was born in July, 1927 in Bangor, daughter of the late Percy and Edna M. Schroyer, sister of Philip, Donald, Harriet and Paul Schroyer. Most of her life she lived in Bangor and was an active member of the Simpson United Methodist Church as well as holding many volunteer positions in the community over the years.
