April 5, 1922 - January 30, 2008

Marion M. Schiele, age 87, of Bangor passed away Wednesday, January 30, 2008 at Bronson Hospital, Kalamazoo surrounded by her family. Marion was born on April 5, 1920 in Chicago, the daughter of Carl and Anna (Meingassner) Wilkening. On May 4, 1946, she married Richard Schiele at St. Michael's Catholic Church, Chicago. Growing up a city girl, Marion moved to their new home, a farm, in Bangor after her marriage. With a newly built house that didn't yet have all the necessities, she had to learn quickly how to adapt to things such as no running water. While raising her family and taking care of her home, she worked at various jobs; McCabe's store and the Bangor Public Schools in the kitchen, are a just a couple. Marion was a devoted member of Sacred Heart Parish. She was involved in many areas of its Christian Service; and for many years, along with her dear friend, Dorothy Johnson, they organized and prepared the funeral luncheons. Marion loved her family and was always concerned for their well being; she was always pointing her finger and saying to them "you be careful". She enjoyed being with people.
