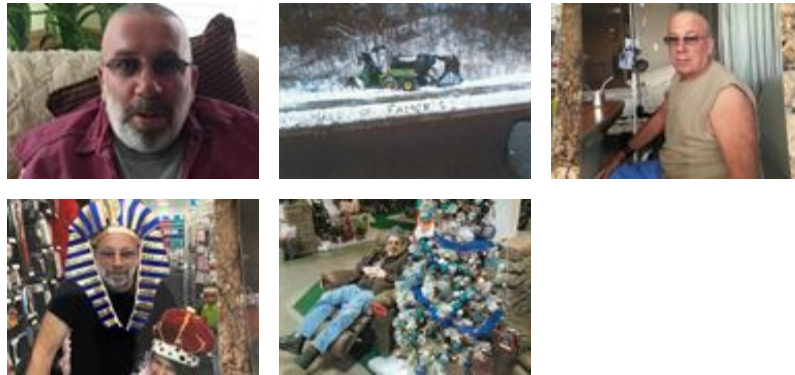

Peter, you never complained even though you were in excruciating pain. And you did it twice! You were so brave and fought so hard to live. It just doesn't feel right without you. We were three, and now there is two. Please watch over your brother, Rob, he still needs you, and I do too. Love you!
