“ Shirley and I were very close. Around fall of 2008, I rented a car at the Detroit airport and drove to Roy and Shirley home in Gobles . The next day we departed to go to Newport for Mother's 90th Birthday. We went I-75 and drove most of the way to Newport on 75. As we pasted through Dayton for a late lunch I called my sister-in-law and had her and her husband join us at Cracker-barrel. Shirley had met my sister in law in 1965 when my son, my wife and her sister were traveling to New Jersey to see another of my wife's sisters as well as to see my Mother. That was the first time my wife and my Mother. But my sister-in law in Dayton had a nice lunch together along with my brother in law. From Dayton we stayed on 75 until we got close to Newport. I think the traveling was tiresome for Roy. He had the puppy, Molly with him in the backseat. We stayed several days in a motel in Newport. We had a family reunion with all of Mother's children mother, my father's brother Bruce and all his children, all of Brice's deceased brother Carl's children except for the oldest daughter who lived in Georga. Shirley had a good visit with the family; that was the last time Shirley and I were together with all our siblings, After that trip Shirley and I stayed in touch almost weekly by phone. After Roy died I phoned more often. After my wife died on valentine's day in 2012; I phoned even more often. We talked a lot about our childhood. We were both very lonely.
